Education, Health, and Care (EHC) Needs Assessment

This sheet tells you about how to get more support for your child (0-16) or young person (16-25) when the extra help they get at their nursery or school is not enough.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs):

My child or young person is getting extra help in their nursery or school, but I'm still worried about how they are getting on. I think they need more support.

What can I do?

Your child or young person may need an Education, Health, and Care (EHC) plan.

An EHC plan is for children and young people with SEN who need more support than the nursery or school can provide from their budget (money).

If your child or young person needs more support, their nursery or school should ask the Local Authority (council) to do an Education, Health, and Care (EHC) Needs Assessment.

This is a detailed assessment of your child's or young person's needs(difficulties) and is the first step to getting an EHC plan.

The Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCO) thinks my child or young person is doing well and say they don't need an EHC Needs Assessment.

What can I do?

You can ask (request) the council to do an EHC Needs Assessment yourself. This is your right, and you can do this by writing and sending a letter to the council.

Will it be quicker if I make the request myself?

No. Once the council tell you they have received the school's EHC Needs Assessment request form or your letter, it will take the same amount of time(See the diagram on the last page).

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How long does the council have to carry out an EHC Needs Assessment and issue a final EHC plan?

From the day the council tells you they received the EHC Needs Assessment request, , they have **20 weeks** to carry out the EHC Neds Assessment, finalise the EHC plan and send it to you(See the diagram on the last page for more information)

What happens if the council says no to an EHC Needs assessment or a EHC plan?

The council may not agree to do an EHC Needs Assessment.

Or the council may do an EHC Needs Assessment but may think your child or young person does not need an EHC plan.

If this happens, you can appeal (challenge their decision at a tribunal) the council's decision.

This is your right. You have **two months** to appeal from the date you receive the letter informing you of the council's decision.

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The Council must finalise the EHC plan within 20 weeks of receiving the EHC Needs Assessment request.

DAY 1

The council sends you a letter to tell you, they have received the request for an Education, Health, and Care (EHC) Needs

In this letter the council must also write,

- They have 6 weeks to make a decision to carry out the assessment or not.
- You can speak to WIASS if you need any help.

<u>6WEEKS</u> AFTER DAY 1

The Council tells you their decision.

If the council thinks your child needs an EHC Needs Assessment you will receive a 'Yes to Assess' letter.

If the council does **not** think your child needs an EHC Needs Assessment you will receive a 'No **to Assess**' letter.

AROUND WEEK 8-10

YES to start an EHC Needs Assessment:

The council use this time to ask a number of professionals for information and advice, about your child's or young person's needs (difficulties), what help they need.

They will ask the professionals to put this information and advice in writing and to send it to them no later than **6 weeks** of being asked.

The council will then make a decision from reading the information and advice about whether they are going to write an EHC plan or not.

YES: Around Week 14

The council have decided to issue an EHC plan because they think your child or young person needs an EHC plan.

They will send you a draft copy to look through with a letter telling you,

- How long you have to look through the EHC plan
- You can speak to WIASS if you need any help.

NO: Week 16

If the council decides not to issue an EHC plan, they **must** tell you why, and of your **right to appeal** their decision.

Week 20

The council will send you the final EHC plan with a letter. In this letter the council must tell you of your right to appeal if you are still unhappy with what's written in the EHC plan (including the name of the nursery or school)
